MUST SELL 100 "Keep Kids Safe" License Plates by Thursday, October 31

Change your license plate and change a child's life. It sounds simple and it is. Proceeds from the Keep Kids Safe license plate go to local child abuse prevention programs, helping to protect vulnerable children and strengthen families across Oregon.

Make a difference today by changing to a Keep Kids Safe (KKS) license plate using one of these three easy ways:

1. **Go to DMV** and submit an application and pay fees before 5 p.m. on Thursday, October 31.
2. **Order by mail using the on-line form or registration renewal notice.** Mailed applications must be post-marked by Thursday, October 31. 3. Request the KKS license plate when you **purchase a new car.**
