
Service Delivery Design

Funding Formula

- ProfessionalDevelopment: 80%
- CommunityCollaboration: 20%
- Cultural and linguistic diversity in providers & children in care

Timeline of Negotiations & Contracts

- □ Announcement of Awards: May 25, 2017
- □ Contract Negotiations: Completed by July 14, 2017
- □ Contracts Signed: September 30, 2017
- □ New Programs Begin: October 1, 2017

Evaluation Process

- Seven members of review team
 - 5 internal & 2 partners
- Conflict of interest clearance
- Trainings on rubrics and rating system
- 3 Meetings: check in and final scoring tabulation
- □ 2 reviewers for each applicant
- Scores averaged and rated with negotiating points
 - Exceeds: 308-232
 - Acceptable: 231-157
 - □ Inconsistent: 156-78
 - Not Acceptable: 77-0

Evaluation Reference Points

Strengths

- Applicants provided great detail with examples
- Data were included to demonstrate need
- Reviewers were able to clearly see applicant exceeded expectations in narratives

Negotiation Points

- More detail is needed on how strategies will be implemented
- Lack of examples and/or data to demonstrate need
- Descriptions state what and may not include how
