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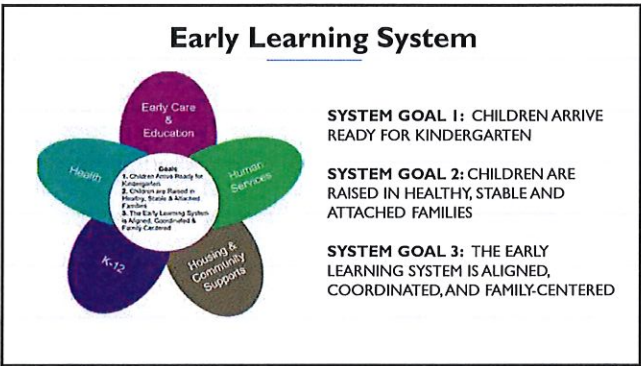

**STRATEGY 3.1 IMPROVE PROFESSIONAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE FULL DIVERSITY OF THE EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION WORKFORCE.**

- **DHS Self Sufficiency Strategic Objective 4.1** Develop and increase internal and external partnerships collaboration, communication and coordination and implement localized solutions with promising outcome within our communities.
- **OHA Public Health** Recruit and retain a diverse, stable and representative workforce with equitable access to professional development, compensation, and career pathways.

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### Raise Up Oregon & Agency Plan Alignment

**Strategy 4.3 INCREASE AND IMPROVE EQUITABLE ACCESS TO EARLY CHILDHOOD ORAL HEALTH.**

- **DHS Child Welfare** All children entering care are required to receive a dental evaluation.
- **OHA Public Health** Cross-system coordination and service integration such as preconception and perinatal health, oral health, physical and mental health, and developmental screening and follow-up.

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### Raise Up Oregon & GRB Alignment

**OHA**

- Universal Home Visiting;
- Office of Child Health

**Housing**

- Increased services to families with young children who are experiencing unsheltered homelessness

**ODE**

- Reduce class sizes in kindergarten - 3<sup>rd</sup> grade

**DHS**

- Increased investment of TANF funds in providing housing for the neediest families with OHCS

**ELD**

- Pay parity with kindergarten teachers in OHSPK and EHS settings;
- Baby Promise and increasing supply of quality infant and toddler care
- Preschool Promise expansion

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### Infant-Toddler Emphasis



17 bullets or strategies with a focus on infants and toddlers

1. Expand access to Oregon's current array of evidenced-based and evidence-informed targeted home visiting programs
2. Create, scale and sustain a statewide, high-quality infant and toddler care program.
3. Create shared service networks to better scale infant and toddler care.
4. Increase state investment in Early Head Start by expanding Oregon PreKindergarten as a prenatal-to-five program.
5. Continuity of care in child care assistance policy
6. Create competencies and professional learning opportunities for infant and toddler educators.

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### Infant-Toddler Emphasis

7. Train providers across sectors about relationship-based infant mental health and equity approaches.
8. Advance provider trainings such as First Tooth and Maternity Teeth for Two.
9. Support families and ECE providers to implement safe sleep practices.
10. Expand array of community services available to infants, toddlers and families that need additional supports.
11. Expand accessible and culturally responsive systems that support family unity and parent health/mental health.
12. Improve access to health care for families who are pregnant or have young children.

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### Infant-Toddler Emphasis

13. Build a system with local communities, Hubs, CCOs, and local public health to deliver home visits for families with newborns to provide parenting information and meets deeper needs.
14. Provide paid family leave to all families with a newborn or newly adopted child.
15. Expand and focus housing subsidy for families with children prenatal to 12 months of age experiencing unsheltered homelessness.
16. Strengthen relationships between Hubs, Community Actions, DHS field offices, and local housing authorities to focus on infants and toddlers.
17. Promote breastfeeding.
