## <u>414-875-0000</u>

### **Definitions**

The following definitions apply to Oregon Administrative Rules 414-875-0000 through 414-875-0050.¶ (1) "Culturally Specific Organization" means an organization that serves a particular cultural community and is primarily staffed and led by members of that community and that demonstrates: intimate knowledge of lived experience of the community, including but not limited to the impact of structural and individual racism or discrimination on the community; knowledge of specific disparities documented in the community and how that influences the structure of their program or service; ability to describe the community's cultural practices, health and safety beliefs/practices, positive cultural identity/pride/resilience, immigration dynamics, religious beliefs, etc. and how their services have been adapted to those cultural norms.¶

(2) "Division" means the Early Learning Division of the Oregon Department of Education.

(3) "Early Learning Services" means programs and services for children ages prenatal through five that address language and literacy development, cognition and general knowledge, learning approaches, physical health and well-being, motor development, and social and emotional development. Providers of Early Learning Services include, but are not limited to: Tribal Nations; Early Learning Hubs; Relief Nurseries; home visiting programs; child care providers; preschools; Head Start programs; Oregon Prenatal to Kindergarten programs; and Preschool Promise programs.¶

(4) "Tribal Early Learning Hub" means the entity designated by the Early Learning Council under ORS 417.831.¶ (5) "Tribal Advisory Committee" means the committee established by the Division for the purpose of advising the Early Learning Council on the Tribal Early Learning Hub, as established in ORS 417.831.¶

(6) "Tribal Nations Early Care & Education Sector Plan" means a community plan developed and distributed by the Tribal Early Learning Hub to Tribal Nations to gather data on needs of Young Children served by Oregon's Tribal Nations.¶

(7) "Young Children" means children being served by an individual Tribal Nation, including, but not limited to: children aged 0 to 5, prenatal women.

Statutory/Other Authority: 417.831

RULE SUMMARY: Outlining who the Tribal Early Learning Hub will serve.

<u>414-875-0010</u> <u>Purpose</u> <u>The Tribal Early Learning Hub is established to coordinate Early Learning Services to Young Children and their families served by Tribal communities in Oregon.</u> <u>Statutory/Other Authority: 417.831</u> <u>Statutes/Other Implemented: 417.831</u>

RULE SUMMARY: Establishing the Tribal Early Learning Hub and outlining oversight between entities.

CHANGES TO RULE:

## <u>414-875-0020</u>

Establishment & Funding

(1) The Tribal Advisory Committee advises the Early Learning Council in oversight of the Tribal Early Learning Hub in accordance with ORS 417.831 to ensure coordination of Early Learning Services.¶

(2) The Division will allocate available funding to the Tribal Early Learning Hub.

(3) The Tribal Early Learning Hub will disburse this funding to each Tribal Nation using a methodology approved by the Division after consultation with the Tribal Advisory Committee.

Statutory/Other Authority: 417.831

RULE SUMMARY: Requiring the Tribal Early Learning Hub to coordinate early childhood services for children served by Tribal Nations in Oregon.

CHANGES TO RULE:

### <u>414-875-0030</u>

**Requirements of Tribal Early Learning Hub** 

(1) The Tribal Early Learning Hub must assess the state of Early Learning Services in tribal communities and establish and monitor measurable outcomes aligned with Raise Up Oregon, found on the Division website, that benefit Young Children. ¶

(2) The Tribal Early Learning Hub must coordinate Early Learning Services for Young Children that incorporate cultural best practices by:

(a) Aligning Early Learning System delivery to create a coordinated system of care by partnering with organizations, including Culturally Specific Organizations when possible, representing the following functional sectors:

(A) Health care services, including social-emotional and behavioral health;¶

(B) Human and social services;¶

(C) Housing services;¶

(D) Education services;¶

(E) Early Learning Services; and ¶

(F) Private sector organizations, including, but not limited to, private businesses or nonprofit organizations.¶ (b) Submitting a Tribal Nations Early Care & Education Sector Plan that assesses the status of Early Learning System coordination on a date and frequency established by the Tribal Advisory Committee for approval by the Division after consultation with the Tribal Advisory Committee.¶

(c) Connecting with organizations allocating resources toward Early Learning Services representing as many sectors as possible described above in (2)(a) to coordinate resources and collaborate toward the set of shared goals outlined in Raise Up Oregon.

RULE SUMMARY: Outlining how agreements are formed between entities.

CHANGES TO RULE:

# <u>414-875-0040</u>

**Administration** 

(1) The Division will administer agreements with the Tribal Early Learning Hub to disburse funding and may administer agreements with the nine federally recognized tribal governments located in Oregon. ¶ (2) The Tribal Early Learning Hub will administer agreements with the nine federally recognized tribal governments located in Oregon to disburse funding. Statutory/Other Authority: 417.831 Statutes/Other Implemented: 417.831

RULE SUMMARY: The Tribal Early Learning Hub must share information with the Division for monitoring.

CHANGES TO RULE:

# <u>Reporting</u>

Upon request by the Division, the Tribal Early Learning Hub shall make available all information and data that demonstrates that the Tribal Early Learning Hub is meeting the minimum required services, or any data or information necessary to monitor and evaluate the Tribal Early Learning Hub program in a manner specified by the Division after consultation with the Tribal Advisory Committee.
